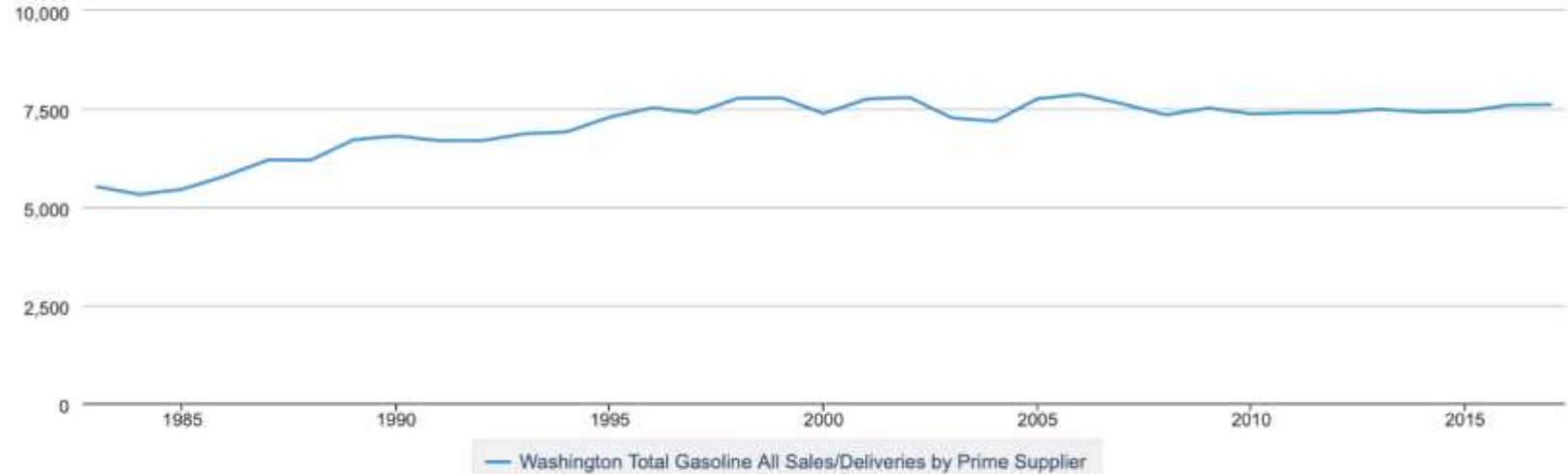


Washingtonians Are Using Less Gasoline
